



Hybrid Learning -- Quick Reference Guide

This guidance document provides a brief overview of the essential information pertaining to the district's Hybrid Learning plan.

Academics

- Academics and instruction will occur daily based on the student's individual schedule. Detailed information will be provided directly by the student's school, following a A/B day rotation.
- Specialized Instruction and accommodations will continue to be provided as determined on a student's IEP or 504 plan.
- Academics will be provided through both an online, virtual model and in-person model. Direct, live instruction will occur daily with a licensed teacher either virtually or in-person.
- Academics will be supported by additional school staff, such as Administration, Social Workers, Counselors and Paraprofessionals.

Attendance

- Attendance will be taken daily by classroom teachers through engagement or direct interaction with each student.
- If a student will be absent, please contact the student's school attendance line and leave the reason for their absence

Food Service

- Meals will be provided to all MTCS students who are on-site for school.
- For students who are learning through a online, virtual model for the day, will be sent home with a meal on the day prior when they are learning in-person.
- If there is a need for a special diet for a student, please complete the special diet form and submit it to the district's food service department.

Transportation

- Transportation services will remain in place for students who will be coming to the school buildings for learning. Details will be communicated with each family regarding pick-up and drop-off times by the Transportation Department.

Safety & Security

- MTCS remains dedicated to the safety and security of students, staff, families and community for any in-person learning activities or engagements that occurs on site at a school building. As a result, the district has put into place a variety of best practices as determined and directed by the Center for Disease Control, MN Department of Health, and the MN Department of Education.
- MTCS asks that all students, staff and families please follow the safety guidelines that are implemented, to support the safety of everyone.
- MTCS also recognizes that cyber safety and security is essential for students to be able to learn. The district is using learning platforms and online technology that is safe and secure. Classroom teachers, School Administrators, and Support Staff will continue to work directly with students and families to ensure that their online learning experience is the best possible.

The district will continue to monitor the information provided by the state, the Minnesota Department of Education, the Minnesota Department of Health, and the Center for Disease Control on a regular basis.
