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


Themes in Comment Section:




Themes from Comment Section:

Yes: Give us the option. I'm tired of wearing my mask. I want to see people's faces. People should get the choice. I can't breathe well with one on.


No: I'm insecure without one. I'll keep wearing one. It is safer with a mask.

Minnesota Transitions Charter School Succession Plan

Minnesota Transitions Charter School (MTCS) has a shared leadership model. The Superintendent / Executive Director has the authority to act on all matters of school governance, subject to the oversight and authority of the Board of Directors, and it's Executive Committee. The Superintendent / Executive Director has convened a leadership team of Directors to assist in the decision making for the network of schools. Although the make-up of the leadership team may change, it currently consists of the following positions:

- Associate Executive Director
- Director of Minnesota Virtual High School
- Director of Curriculum and Instruction
- Director of Student Services
- Director of MTS Elementary
- Director of Banaadir Academy
- Director of ELL
- Director of Banaadir Elementary
- Director of PEASE Academy

This Plan includes three parts:

- 1) A **Short-Term** plan for who will be in charge if the Superintendent / Executive Director is out of the building for a short period of time. Typically this is when he/she is out of the building for all or part of a day, or is gone from the school for up to two weeks.
- 2) An **Intermediate** plan for what would happen if the Superintendent / Executive Director is not able to handle the operations and administration of MTCS for longer than two weeks, and/or in the event of an emergency, including the death or disability of the Superintendent / Executive Director.
- 3) A **Succession** plan for what would happen if the Superintendent/ Executive Director has announced his/her intent to retire or if the Superintendent / Executive Director's employment is otherwise terminated.

1. Short-Term Plan:

When the Superintendent / Executive Director is out of the building, the leadership team will handle and address all communication and decisions pertaining to the facility, purchasing, payroll, and community relations. They will each handle the duties to which they are assigned. Major decisions may be delayed, at the option of the leadership team member, until the Superintendent / Executive Director is able to return, or until the Superintendent / Executive Director weighs in on the decision, if possible.

Decisions relating to students, parents and staff will be the responsibility of the Principal/Director in the building, along with the corresponding member of the Cabinet who is responsible for that program, if any.

Because of the short duration of the Superintendent / Executive Director's absence, Board members would not need to be informed or involved in the decision-making process. The Board Chair or Executive Committee may be notified of an absence lasting more than a few days.

2. Intermediate Plan

If the Superintendent / Executive Director is unable to work for a period of over two weeks, or in the event that he/she cannot perform their duties, such as the death or hospitalization of the Superintendent, an intermediate plan will be declared by the Board Chair and the Executive Committee. In the shortest time period possible, but no longer than 10 days, the Executive Committee of the Board will decide whether or not to hire an Interim Superintendent / Executive Director until the Superintendent / Executive Director has recovered and is able to perform his/her duties, or until a permanent replacement is secured. A consultant may be employed to assist the Board in the search for the Interim Superintendent / Executive Director or a current Cabinet member may be appointed.

Until the time that an Interim Superintendent / Executive Director is hired and begins his/her duties, or until the Superintendent / Executive Director is able to return to his/her duties, the Associate Superintendent / Associate Executive Director will fulfill the duties of the Superintendent / Executive Director. If the Associate Superintendent / Associate Executive Director is unable to fulfill these duties, the Director of Minnesota Virtual Schools shall fulfill these duties. The full School Board shall meet to confirm the hiring of any Interim Superintendent / Executive Director.

In summary:

- Within 10 days the Executive Committee of the Board will convene to determine whether to hire an Interim Superintendent / Interim Executive Director in the absence of the Superintendent / Executive Director.
- 2. When it is determined that the intermediate plan is activated, the Associate Superintendent / Associate Executive Director will fulfill the executive functions of MTCS until the Board has hired an interim replacement for the Superintendent / Executive Director.
- 3. If the Associate Superintendent / Associate Executive Director is unable to fulfill these duties while the Board hires an interim Superintendent / Interim Executive Director, the Director at Minnesota Virtual Schools will fulfill the executive functions of MTCS.
- 4. The full School Board will meet to confirm the hiring of any interim Superintendent / Executive Director.

3. Succession Plan

In the event that the Superintendent / Executive Director leaves his/her employment due to voluntary or involuntary termination or retirement, the Intermediate Plan, described above, will be followed.

Specifically, with regards to retirement, the Executive Committee and the Director of Human Resources shall meet and outline the steps that will be taken to hire a permanent successor. If practicable, a successor may be employed while the current Superintendent / Executive Director is still working at MTCS in order to help with the transition. The successor may act as an Assistant Superintendent and gradually take on more of the Superintendent's duties. The period of time for the successor to serve in the role of Assistant Superintendent shall not exceed one year.

Specifically, with regards to involuntary termination, the Superintendent / Executive Director will be relieved of his/her duties, effective immediately. The Board Chair will collect his/her keys, passes, computers, and any other school property. The outgoing Superintendent / Executive Director may collect their personal belongings at a time that is agreed upon by the Board of Directors or the Executive Committee, and at least two Board Members will be present while the outgoing Superintendent / Executive Director collects those items.
